Fall River Suicide Prevention Community Conversation

Victims of suicide and attempted suicide spoke out at a forum organized by the Suicide Prevention Task Force of United Neighbors of Fall River and Partners for a Healthier Community on April 4, 2016 at Blessed Trinity Church. Forty people attended to hear stories of despair and courage that involved either persons who attempted suicide or persons who experienced the suicide of a loved one. The session began with a panel moderated by Herald News Editorial Page Editor Aaron Freschette and then opened the floor to input by others affected by suicide. Before concluding the forum, United Neighbors of Fall River Executive Director Wendy Garf-Lipp spoke about the work of the Task Force and called on School Community Partnership organizers Annemarie Holly and Diman Regional High School Adjustment Counselor Michaela Gagne-Hetzler to describe their work with students in the Fall River schools. Formed to respond to the rising incidence of suicides in Bristol County and to promote prevention, education and support services, the group meets monthly at the HealthFirst Family Care Center.

On April 8th during National Youth Violence Prevention Week, FRYVP hosted a Police Youth Dialogue at BMC Durfee High School with Durfee and Diman Regional High School students. Peace by Peace Summit Adult Session

Sponsored by the Bristol County District Attorney's Office, the Fall River Shannon Community Safety Initiative, Saint Anne's Hospital, Southcoast Hospitals, United Neighbors and Partners, this year's event on May 26th offered an opportunity to learn from Phil Boyte of Learning for Living. Phil established Learning for Living in 1984 from his vision for building communities of care on campuses around the country. He brought his unique approach to building and strengthening relationship skills to about thirty human service professionals who work with youth in Greater Fall River. This 45-minute session got participants engaged in getting to know one another in ways they never had before, demonstrating how a caring culture can be created in schools and youth programs.

Phil's techniques help to reveal truths that stimulate self-reflection and community-building among students. Participants find that they do not live in isolation, rather, within a community that depends on each of its members to thrive. Phil established Learning for Living in 1984 from his vision for building communities of care on campuses around the country. He brought his unique approach to building and strengthening relationship skills on May 27, 2016 to over twenty-five human service professionals and volunteers and over 140 students recruited from Fall River Public Schools, Diman Regional High School, the Youth Outreach Program, YouthBuild, and more!

Fall River Named All-America City Award Recipient

The National Civic League announced the ten winners of the 2016 All-America City Award, an honor given each year to towns, cities, counties, tribes, neighborhoods and metropolitan regions who demonstrate outstanding civic accomplishments. The Award recognizes the use of collaborative problem-solving strategies that link private, public and nonprofit sectors. This year, the program highlighted community efforts to ensure that all children are healthy and successful in school and life. Fall River was one of ten cities who received the award based on its efforts at positive youth development, improved school attendance, and the formation of a City-wide Parent Academy.
